

# Curriculum Overview – Year 3 - Term 6

## Computing

We will be continuing with internet safety this term, thinking about how useful the internet is for finding information and what information should not be shared online.

## Geography

This term we will be learning about the coast of the British Isles, considering the advantages and disadvantage of living by the sea.

## R. E.

We continue with the question from last term. We explore what Christians do to show their faith within their church communities including what they do together and why.

## English

This term we will be looking at the book Edward Tulane by Kate DiCamillo. Edward is an immaculate china rabbit. Abilene, his owner, adores and cares for him completely but Edward is self-centred and heartless. Then, through a series of accidents, Edward is separated from Abilene. We will empathise with the character in the story and write in role exploring Edward's feelings.

## DT

Our Moving Monsters unit incorporates the children's science knowledge and how air pressure is used to control moving parts. The children will work as teams to use a range of hand tools safely.

## French

This term, we will learn the names of vegetables and how to say which we like and dislike. We will also learn how to say what we would like to buy in a market. We will then go on to describe the life cycle of a plant.

## Music

This term, we shall be exploring musical phrases, melodic imitation and rounds - using a score and combining sounds to create different musical textures.



## P.S.H.E.

Our topic this term is 'New Beginnings'. We will be developing our knowledge, understanding and skills in key social and emotional aspects of learning (empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation).

## P. E.

This term the children will concentrate on developing good basic running, jumping and throwing techniques. They are set challenges for distance and time.

## Home Learning

Your child should read their AR reading book every evening and take quizzes in school to work towards their target. Homework will also be sent home and your child should complete a Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner before the end of term. **Please remember that your child will need a water bottle every day.**

## Science

Our Plants topic allows the children to identify and describe the functions of different parts of plants - roots, stem, leaves and flowers. We explore the role of flowers in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal

## Maths

This term we focus on solving word problems. We use our knowledge of addition and subtraction to solve capacity questions and record results in litres and ml. We introduce addition and subtraction of fractions and solve word problems that involve the amount of a quantity. We then solve questions such as 'how many more' using information presented in a bar chart and pictogram.
