

Curriculum Overview – Year 2- Term 3

Computing

In our iSearch topic we will be using the internet to find answers to questions and to check the validity of the information given.

History

In our topic 'The Victorians' we will be finding out about the Victorian way of life. We will also be Victorians for the day.

R. E.

Looking at the religions of Christianity, Islam and Judaism, we will be exploring the question: How and why do we celebrate special and sacred times?

English

This term we will be focusing on stories by the same author and how these compare, looking at similarities and differences between the texts. We will also be writing in role as a Victorian child cotton mill worker as part of our topic one The Victorians and writing emotive poems.

Art

Looking at Art this term we will find out about a famous Victorian artist – William Morris. We will also be drawing responding to music.



Maths

This term will begin with place value and number facts and then move onto addition and subtraction and how we can use these to solve problems. Then we will look at money and measuring – focusing on mass, using practical ways to weigh and compare weights.

Science

In Science we will be focusing on animals including humans. We will look at how humans change as they grow older and what they need to survive.

P.S.H.E.

Our topic for PSHE this term will be 'Good to be me.' We will be exploring feeling and realising that it really is 'good to be me'!

P. E.

In P.E. we will be developing our skills in our unit on Dance, exploring different ways to move our bodies to music.

Music

We will be covering the topics 'Animals' to develop our understanding of pitch and 'Number' where we will explore rhythm patterns.
