Dear Parents/Guardians of children in Year 1-6,

Last night the government announced that the lockdown will continue for at least another three weeks. I do not have any information on if, or when, schools might re-open. Whilst we wait, here is the latest information about home learning to follow up on my newsletter sent on Wednesday.

Home learning

As you know, from Monday 20th April and then every morning after that, your child's teacher will email learning for the day. This should be completed with your child and then emailed back to the teacher via this address teachers@canterbury-road.kent.sch.uk. Please write the class number/s and your child/rens' names in the subject line so each teacher can find the work for their class – thank you.

It would be best if you could send the work back every day so the teacher can mark it and give feedback before the next piece of work. This means that any issues or difficulties can be followed up straight away. The work can be done on paper or a whiteboard and you can scan or save the work and email it, or take a photo on your 'phone and email that.

I know a few parents do not have the IT equipment to do this easily and are trying to read work off their mobile 'phones. If you are struggling with this, text me on 07544 811224 and I will make arrangements to support you with this next week. Don't forget to say whose parent you are!

The class teacher will also email some topic work each Monday. This can be done on any day and returned for marking in the same way. We are also sending home a challenge sheet which is just for fun and these activities do not need to be sent back to school.
