

# Curriculum Overview – Year 4 – Term 6

## Computing

In this unit children will begin to learn about the risks and benefits of sharing information online.

## Geography

In Geography this term we will be answering the question 'Can the Earth shake, rattle and roll?'.

## R. E.

In R.E. this term we will be answering the question 'Why are festivals important to religious communities?'

## English

This term we will be reading 'Varjak Paw' by S.F. Said. Through this book we will be writing in role through diary writing, exploring characters through discussion texts and writing descriptive poetry.

## Art

In Art this term we will explore and experiment with a variety of dip dye, knotting and wrapping techniques in responding to the work of Michael Brennand-Wood; comment on ideas, methods and approaches used in their own and others' work and adapt and improve our own work.



## Maths

This term in Maths we will be solving problems involving capacity, solving problems involving fractions to divide quantities including non-unit fractions where the answer is a whole number and multiplying two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number using an expanded written layout.

## Science

This term the children will continue to look at sound. They will find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it and recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

## P.S.H.E.

In P.S.H.E. this term we will be reflecting on our time in Year 4 and looking forward to new beginnings.

## P. E.

In P.E. this term we will be developing our running, jumping and throwing techniques. We will be setting challenges for ourselves.

## French

In this unit, the children learn a wider variety of phrases to talk about the weather and learn how to say the temperature. They also learn the names of some common articles of clothing worn in different types of weather.

## Home Learning

Your child should read their AR reading book every evening and take quizzes in school to work towards their target. Homework will also be sent home and your child should complete a Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner before the end of term.

## Music
